SEASONS FOR GROWTH: Small group Grief & Loss Education program

Each year we offer the opportunity for students who have experienced grief and loss to be involved in this program. The program has been designed to support all children and young people who have experienced loss and change. Content areas include change and loss as part of life, feelings, memories, choices and moving forward. Participating in the program aims to support young people to develop skills in communicating, coping, decision making and problem solving.

The Seasons for Growth grief and loss education program is conducted over eight 40-50 minute sessions with small groups of 4-7 children and supported by a trained adult facilitator ('Companion').

In each session students learn about a range of robots - from simple robots that can be programmed with Scratch to one of the world's most advanced humanoids, NAO. Students will build their own BinaryBot Robot to take home and also work with the modular EZ-Robot platform. In addition to robot construction and programming, students will discuss ethical issues associated with robots and be exposed to interesting STEM projects.
