
#### **FOOTY TIPPING:**

#### **PREP**

We are excited to be learning about where food comes from. In Reading, we are finding out about different sounds that letters can make, including double consonants and plural S. In Maths we have been learning about subtraction.

#### YEAR ONE / TWO

The 1/2's have continued hunting for verbs through close reads of Pamela Allen's stories. We have also worked hard to finish publishing our fairy-tales. In Maths, we have been working hard to revise our knowledge of number facts and the four operations. We enjoyed making Multiplication Monsters. We also really loved writing a friendship cloud about what makes a great friend.

#### YEAR THREE / FOUR

The 3/4's are gearing up for a great term of STEM projects. We have already looked at force and motion and inertia and spoken about some of Isaac Newton's work in these areas. In Maths we are looking at Fractions and Decimals and have started using the Prodigy program in our homework. Year 3's are looking forward to their first Eucharist.

#### YEAR FIVE / SIX

The 5/6's had a great time today during their incursion, learning about electrical circuits, conductors and insulators. In Maths, we're continuing to look at fractions and how to add, subtract and multiply fractions with the same and different denominators. In Religion we are exploring our understanding of 'justice' in our world and looking at the broader concept of 'What is justice for the poor?'


