Dear Parents

Yesterday we had our Prep 2016 Information sessions and school tours at 9.05, 11.35 and 7.30 pm. We have had 42 applications so far for children commencing Prep in 2016. The closing date for Applications is Friday 15th May. So for parents who already have children enrolled at St. Mary's but have another child starting school you also need to get your applications in by the 15th May. If you know of any other parents who might be interested in putting in an application please ask them to do so as soon as possible. Parents can contact the school office to arrange an individual appointment and school tour.
