## <u>OUR 2022 PARISH RENEWAL PROGRAM –</u> RESULTS:

No could have one envisaged the unprecedented and significant challenges that we experienced in 2020 and 2021 associated with the present Coronavirus. Although many of those extraordinary times are behind us, our reengagement as a parish community is not yet at pre-pandemic levels. However, we resolved to conduct our Parish Renewal Program during which we were challenged to commit to serve our community by joining parish groups and ministries and increase our Thanksgiving income.

Pleasingly, 26 parishioners signed up to volunteer in our various groups and ministries joining those who are continuing but did not complete a new form. Thanksgiving income has increased by 27.6% from \$1,200 to \$1,531.54 per week - pledged by 141 givers (i.e. 118 existing givers and 23 new contributors). Cash pledges totalling \$1,009.23 per week from 93 66% givers represent of our weekly Thanksgiving income. Credit Card and Direct Debit/Payment pledges of \$522.31 per week from 48 givers represent 34% of our weekly Thanksgiving income.

Thank you very much everyone who contributed to the Program and who helped to achieve these outcomes – they will help maintain our important work and fund some plans for the parish. *Archpriest Michael.*




# Welcome to the Safeguarding Essentials training module for all Volunteers.


The Safeguarding Essentials online training module for all clergy and volunteers is now This compulsory module has been developed for all volunteers of the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne (CAM). importance of training volunteers has been articulated in the Victorian Child Safe Standards. the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards and the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations on which the CAM Safeguarding and Wellbeing Policy for Children and Young People is This accessible and engaging based. resource provides clergy and volunteers with foundational knowledge and understanding of their duty of care and expectations in relation to safeguarding children, young people and vulnerable persons from all forms of abuse and harm. This will be an annual requirement for everyone and possible to complete individually online or as a group session. At the completion of the training, participants will receive a certificate of completion and the parish will also receive notification that the module has been completed successfully. 
