### CLASS GROUPINGS FOR 2016:

The teachers will soon begin the very involved task of organising children into their class groupings for 2016. This is a lengthy process as many things are taken into consideration. The following guidelines are used to assist us in creating the most effective classroom structures possible so that all children are given the opportunity to succeed and to achieve their full potential educationally, socially, spiritually, emotionally and physically. Things we consider are: Friendship Groups, Academic Ability, Behaviour, Gender Balance, Immediate/Extended Family, Maturity Level, Number of children on LNSLN Funding, Personality, Prior History (eg. Previous Teachers, Oldest or Youngest in the group) and Social Skills. **Transition is the process or a period of changing from one state or condition to another.**

Successful school transitions are crucial to the development of a young person's academic and social emotional wellbeing. Building resilience assists young people in better managing the exciting yet unsettling process of change of school transitions.

This session will assist parents in supporting young people to address the common issues and concerns underpinning school transition.

The session will offer parents steps they can take to help support their child during key transitions at school (kinder to Prep / year level to year level / primary to secondary), as well as suggest strategies to support children's educational resilience, enhancing opportunities for school success.
