

### Dear Parents

There have been a couple of issues that have been brought to my attention by both staff and parents that I am concerned about and would like to share with you. The first one is that there seems to be an increasing number of children playing on the basketball court especially before school. We ask that children not arrive at school BEFORE 8.30 am. Any children that do arrive before this time MUST report to the school Office Foyer and remain there until Playground Supervision commences at 8.30 am. Then they remain on the Netball Court or for Preps and Year One/Two's the Junior Adventure Playground or the Netball Court and that there are NO Ball Games or Running Games for the safety of everyone. These are also the only areas which are supervised by staff. No children are to play on the Senior Adventure Playground Before or After School unless their parent is physically present to supervise them.

The second one is concerning dogs. I'm aware some parents are supporting our promotion of Active Lifestyle by walking their child/ren to school and their dog which is to be commended however from a Health & Safety Workplace aspect I do ask that no dogs are taken inside buildings and that all dogs are on a lead controlled by an adult while in the school grounds. If you wish to take your dog into a building/classroom please request permission from myself before doing so.

Thank you for your co-operation in these matters.

## EASTER RAFFLE:

Our Annual Easter Raffle is upon us once again. The Parents & Friends Association will be sending home a book of raffle tickets (10 tickets) per family to sell early next week. Extra books can be requested from the school office. We ask each family to donate an Easter egg or plush toy (dairy and gluten free eggs are appreciated). The eggs/toys are left in the Easter boxes in the classrooms and are collected each morning by the Easter Bunny's helpers. *Through the magic of Easter, these become the raffle prizes.* We usually end up with enough prizes for most children to win one. Easter donations can be brought to school starting Monday 16<sup>th</sup> March. The Easter Raffle will be drawn at a Special Assembly on the last day of this term at 2.00 pm. Please be aware the Curriculum Levy (\$220 per child) and the Excursion/Incursion Levy (\$60 per child), were due and payable today. If you are having difficulty meeting this portion of the school fee, please contact the School Office to make an appointment to see me so that we can arrange an alternative settlement.

Your School Fee (\$1200 per family) plus other costs outlined by Class Level in the Fees Summary can be paid in full or in part payments with final settlement by Friday 11<sup>th</sup> September. All of the above can be paid by Direct Debit instalments. Instalments contracts can still be commenced, and can be allocated on a bi-monthly, monthly or fortnightly basis. ARE YOU READY TO TAKE UP THE CHALLENGE.....? THE 2015 VICTORIAN PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE.

This is the **11<sup>th</sup> year** for the VPRC and St. Mary's students have proudly been part of the Challenge EVERY year. The Challenge encourages Victorian students to read more frequently and more broadly. Last year at St. Mary's we had **130 children** who met the challenge. Some children have done so every year! Once again we are encouraging all students from Prep to Year 6 to join in the challenge.

Children who have participated in previous Challenges will know that there are **many benefits** in taking part. As well as the intrinsic rewards of reading, each student who completes the Challenge will **receive a certificate**.

## How to Meet the Challenge

There are rules you need to follow to meet the Challenge.

- register as a Challenger and make sure you keep a record of your reading on the Challenge website (How?...further on in note)
- read the following number of books during the Challenge.

Year level	Number of books	Number from the Challenge book list
Prep – Year 2	30 books	20 or more
Year 3 – Year 6	15 books	10 or more

## If you are in Prep, Year 1 or Year 2

You can read books by yourself or with someone else. You can read books with your:

- parents
- teacher
- brother or sister
- buddy or friend.

They can help you or read the book to you if you are just learning to read.

# Where can I get books for the Challenge?

You should be able to find many suitable books in our school or local library. You may have books at home that you can add to your children's reading lists. Remember too that you can add books that are not listed on the Challenge book list – these can be added as personal choice books.

Lists of books can be located on our school website.

## Recording Books You Have Read.

Students in Year 3 to 6 will need to enter online the books they have read by themselves. Most children will do this at school but it can be done at home. Prep and Year One / Two students will have the books that have been read to them or they have read during class time at school entered for them.

Please complete the '2015 Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge Consent form' attached to the newsletter and return to your child's classroom teacher as soon as possible.

It is optional to complete Section 2 which gives permission for your child's name to be published in The Herald Sun.







As a means to promote the importance of reading among students in Victorian schools and to encourage families and parents to be more involved with supporting children's reading, in and beyond school, the Victorian Government has continued its support.

Details of the Challenge are available at <u>www.education.vic.gov.au/prc</u>.

## PLEASE NOTE:

**SECTION 1** of the consent form attached <u>must</u> be signed if your child is to participate in the Challenge and receive a Certificate of Achievement

## SECTION 2 of the consent form below is optional.

In October/November 2015 an Honour roll lift-out in The Herald Sun will contain the names of all Victorian children who completed the Challenge (publication only with the permission of their parents or guardians). Consent is sought from students and parents for the publication of names following the conclusion of the Challenge.

When consenting, you authorise collection of the names of the students who are participating and their schools by the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development.

This information will only be used for the purpose of conducting the Challenge in 2015 and printing certificates of achievement for students who meet the Challenge. If you consent, the student will be issued by their school with a username and password.

All queries will remain confidential and all information that is to be provided to the Department will be held via a secure website and kept confidential in accordance with the Information Privacy Act 2000.

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

Definitions: Department refers to the Victorian Department of Education and Training, Person refers to the child/adult listed below in the consent declaration.

### 1) Privacy Protection

The Department takes its privacy obligations seriously and any personal information collected or used by the Department will be handled in accordance with the

Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014 (Vic). This law sets out what we must do when the Department collects, uses, handles and destroys personal information. Personal information includes personal details such as an individual's name and school that could be used to identify an individual.

## 2) Collection, use, disclosure and storage of personal information

If you provide your consent your school or early childhood setting will collect and disclose your child's first and last name, and the name of the early childhood setting or school to the Department. The Department will then:

- Use the information to register your child and to generate an online account (through which school age children can record the books that they read);
- Publish your child's name and year level on its online Honour Roll located at: <u>www.education.vic.gov.au/prc</u> at the completion of the Challenge with <u>no</u> other identifying factors such as school name.
- Give the name of your child to Finsbury Green Pty Ltd ABN 52 007 743 151 who will then disclose to a 3rd party for the purpose of printing Certificates of Achievement.
- 3) Accuracy, access to information and withdrawal of consent

The Department will endeavour to ensure that any personal information held about your child is up to date and accurate. You can access, correct and withdraw personal information held by the Department by written request in accordance with the Department's Information Privacy Policy located at:
