



I recently did a short-written survey with participants at our **Wednesday Community Morning Tea.** 

Attendees normally include those returning from the **Willy Walking Group**, as well as EAL and Computer students going to morning beak, and 'drop ins'.

We received 26 responses. Over 50 per cent noted that they were doing other activities at the centre (classes, programs, courses, etc).

The overwhelming majority of the participants enjoyed both the walk and morning tea.

They liked -

- Ability to walk at own pace.
- · Comradeship.
- Exercise.
- Catch up for a chat.
- Social activity.
- Meeting new people.
- Companionship.
- Friendly staff.
- The fruit and cakes.
- Generous amounts of food.
- Warm interaction.
- Meeting others.
- Being with others.
- Practice English speaking.



There were very few 'dislikes'.

A few wanted more food, and a few wanted less food. Very difficult to keep everyone happy!

While this project focuses on simple weekly activities, its impact goes far beyond a walk or a cup of tea.

It creates an inclusive, welcoming space that brings together people from different ages, cultures, and life experiences.

Importantly, this project builds community connection and trust.

These informal gatherings serve as an entry point into broader engagement with education, volunteering, and local services offered by our Centre and partners.
