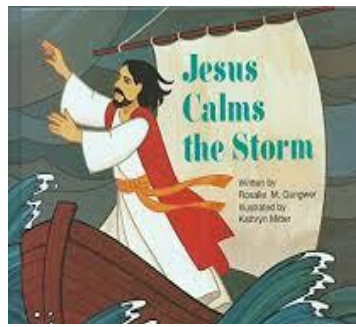

COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Information
Updated: 10 June 2021, 12:00 p.m.

The number of people permitted in the church is up to **75 people**. Density quotient **1 person per 4 sqm applies**.

It will only be necessary to ring in and book your name if you wish to attend the 10.30am Mass on Sunday. Please ring the parish mobile: **(0434 088 900)** and book **by 3 p.m.** the previous day. Parishioners are required to **QR** their entry which means you will need to bring your mobile phone from now on, or sign in your full name and phone number **only if** you do not have a smart phone.

Masks must be worn indoors and the 1.5 metres physical distancing rule applies.
