

Taken from the third of the Songs of the Suffering Servant, in this reading, the servant declares his confidence in divine help, even in the face of great opposition.

Second Reading

James 2:14-18

Following last week's exhortation to be doers of the word and not just hearers, this Sunday, James reminds us that our faith in Christ must be expressed in good works. **Gospel Reading**

Mark 8:27-35

Today's gospel reading contains both Peter's profession of faith in Jesus and Jesus' first prediction of his own passion and resurrection. Jesus also proclaims the mystery of losing one's life in order to save it.


