COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne Information Updated: 10 June 2021, 12:00pm

The number of people permitted in church is up to **50 people.** Density quotient **1 person per 4 sqm applies.**

Parishioners will once again need to register by phone for any Mass. If you wish to attend weekday Masses (including Saturday morning) please ring the parish landline 9398 2964 by 3pm the previous day.

If you wish to attend Saturday night vigil Mass or Sunday morning Masses, please ring the parish mobile (0434 088 900) and book by 4pm the previous day. Please make sure you specify which Mass you wish to attend. You will be required to QR your entry which means you will need to bring your mobile phone from now on, or sign in your full name and phone number only if you do not have a smart phone. We are able to register 50 parishioners for each Mass. Masks must be worn indoors and the 1.5 metres physical distancing rule applies.
