SCHOOL FEES:

Curriculum Levy & Excursion/Incursion Levy will remain the same for 2019. However the Family Fee has increased by \$50:

Family Fee (per family) - \$ 1550.00 Curriculum Levy (per child) - \$ 220.00 Excursion Levy (per child) - \$ 70.00

Additional charges for Camps, Sacraments etc will be added to your school fees dependant on the year level of your child/ren.

Please note in a change from past years, one third of your total school fee is to be paid by the end of Term 1 (5/4/2019), two thirds of the total fee by the end of Term 2 (28/06/2019) and the final third paid by the end of Term 3 (20/09/2018). Failure to do so will result in your account being placed in arrears.

School Fee Statements will be sent home next week, together with comprehensive details of our payment options which include Direct Debit.

IMPORTANT:

Beginning of the year Parent / Teacher 5 minute "Getting to Know You" interviews will be held between 3.20 – 5.30 pm on Monday 4th February.

The purpose of this meeting is to learn as much as we can about your child from you. It is NOT a progress report but rather a sharing of information meeting.

We ask ALL parents to attend. If you are unable to make this meeting we ask you to arrange with your child's teacher another mutual date and time to meet in the near future. Hopefully you have booked your interview time already but if you haven't please do so immediately. You can book interviews at times that suit your family best.

If your child has the same teacher as last year and circumstances haven't changed you do not have to make an appointment.

In Week 2, all students from Year 1 to Year 6 reading will be assessed using the BAS (Benchmark Assessment System).

The BAS is a tool that identifies not only a child's reading level but also his/her ability to **comprehend** what they have read. The information gained from this assessment will be used to identify strengths and weaknesses in the students which teachers will be able to address when planning lessons. This requires teachers to work one on one with each student for 30 minutes.

To enable this to happen, all classroom teachers will be given 2/3 days to complete this testing. Staff who do not have a classroom such as support staff and the specialist teachers etc will be working in classrooms but we have also employed a number of Emergency Teachers to assist with this process.

As a result there will be no Performing Arts, Creative Arts or Physical Education sessions next week. Specialist classes will commence in Week 3.

All students who are interested are welcome to attend these swim sessions however they must be able to swim at least 50m using a recognised swimming stroke. Timing will take place at both sessions so it is important to attend at least one of them.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments, your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
