Child Safety has come to the forefront in education circles this year following the Ministerial Order No. 870, which highlights the importance of keeping all children safe from harm. Just like all other Catholic and Government schools, St. Mary's will be working towards complying with standards set by the government, which will show our commitment to providing a safe and nurturing culture for all students and young people in our care. Over the coming weeks and into 2017 we will provide you with information about each of the seven standards and what each means for our school community.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter on Friday 28th October, we will be holding our **RED DAY FOR CHILD SAFETY** to highlight the importance of keeping our children safe. We remind you to reinforce the safety messages in last week's newsletter with your children.

As you would know, a high number of children and teenagers have access to social media and **staying safe online has never been more important**. **Please be extra vigilant** when your children are online. It is so easy for them to write and receive things that are inappropriate. A reminder too for all parents that the legal age for signing on to Facebook is 13.

The Victorian Police Legacy has produced a Child Safety Handbook. It aims to raise awareness about the risks to children and the steps that can be taken to protect them and keep them safe. These handbooks are available for collection from the school office. Books can only be collected by adults.
