#### **SOCIAL MEDIA:**

It has come to our attention that many of our students are using the social media platform <u>Instagram</u>. This app is ONLY recommended for people over the age of 13. We are not in a position to tell you whether your children can access this app at home however there are a few tips we would like to share with you to ensure your children remain safe if you are allowing them to use Instagram.

- Please ensure your child's account is set to private. This means that if other users wish to 'follow' them
  that the user needs to be approved by your child before they have access to their photos.
- It's a good idea to go through the list of people who are 'following' your child (users who can see your child's photos) and who they are 'following' (the other users whose photos your child can see). A lot of people follow celebrities like musicians, actors and even football players. You will need to use your discretion as to whether you are happy with that as some of these accounts do contain inappropriate content. When going through people who are following your child it is a good idea to ensure that EACH user is someone your child knows (relatives, neighbours, friends etc). There are many 'spam' accounts out there and if these accounts are following your child they have access to all your child's photos.
- If you come across users that are following your children that they don't know or you are not happy with, that user can easily be blocked so they will no longer have access to your child's photos.
- It's important to discuss with your child what photos and comments are appropriate to be posting online.
   What you think is inappropriate the children might think is okay, so make sure they understand your expectations.

This social media world (the world in which your children are growing up in) is ever evolving and changing. It is important to keep your finger on the pulse with what your kids are up to online! 
