

St. Mary's School Altona School Governance Structure

Catholic schools, in general, are responsible and accountable to their students, parents, their local Catholic community, their Bishop and to both the State and Commonwealth Governments. The most important of these responsibilities is to the parents of the students placed in the school's care.

Catholic schools are committed to care for each student's physical, emotional, intellectual and spiritual wellbeing. They prepare students for their place in society as mature, well-adjusted and literate people. Catholic schools are called to foster partnerships with parents and guardians in their role as the principal educators of their child.

St. Mary's School maintains a 'culture of child safety' by actively implementing strategies in accordance with its moral & legal obligations and Victorian Government Ministerial Order 870.

The Principal and Staff of a Parish Primary School are accountable to the Parish priest for the conduct and operation of the parish school.

The CECV receives all Commonwealth and State Governments grants and distributes these funds to schools. The CECV reports to government on Catholic schools' use of these public funds in accordance with the legislation that authorises the grants.

Victorian Catholic schools are subject to the authority of particular bodies that regulate and monitor standards of learning, teaching and facilities. Catholic schools are bound by the Acts and regulations of both Commonwealth and Victorian Parliaments, the authority of the Victorian Minister for Education and by bodies such as the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority which regulates the Victorian Essential Learning Standards (VELS).

Consistent with diocesan policies and the requirements of regulatory bodies, individual schools have considerable autonomy in developing appropriate curriculum and structures that best suit their community and circumstances.
